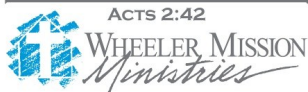

After the SLT program, he entered into the Re-Entry Supportive Housing program (RESH) at Wheeler Mission, where he found a job working for ICA-ADA (Indiana Counselors Association on Alcohol and Drug Abuse) He then began cultivating a relationship with his now fiancée, Michelle. Josh quickly began moving towards his goal to become a counselor, and is now a Board Certified Alcohol & Drug Counselor, doing group adolescent counseling as well as individual counseling at the Emberwood Center. Though Josh is certified to counsel in the secular field, his real passion is biblical counseling. He is now enrolled at Crossroads Bible College, working towards his Bachelor's degree in biblical counseling.

As for church, Josh has been a member at Indy Metro Church for nearly a year, where he serves on Sundays by controlling the sound board. On Wednesdays, he helps lead a small group. After a few months in the RESH Program at Wheeler, Josh moved into a town home with two fellow Hebron alumni in downtown Indianapolis. He says this has "surrounded him with accountability."

The Lord has restored Josh to his family; he has grown closer to his mother, father, and sister. Josh also has a niece and a nephew, both of whom he adores. He enjoys nothing more than to spend his free time with them. His gratitude for the restoration of these relationships is apparent when you speak to him.

Josh has much on his plate with work, school, and family, not to mention a wedding coming soon (May 12, 2012), but he still tries to make sure he observes quiet time with the Lord. He confessed that his biggest struggle has been to be intentional about his Bible reading and devotional time. Josh also admits that he is sometimes gets caught up in the "business" of life. Though he writes a journal or prays each morning, he sometimes finds himself "too busy" to read the Bible. Fortunately, Josh has been proactive to follow his convictions and has surrounded himself with other Christians who keep him accountable.

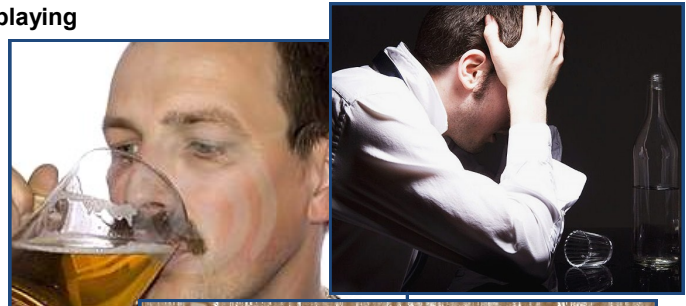

The biggest thing I've seen tear people down in recovery is their involvement in social drinking. Some guys do it alone, some grab a willing partner, and some even work hard at convincing their wife to join them. Nearly all will find a scripture or two to selfishly argue their point.

The end has consistently been the same... people get hurt, people are led astray, and testimonies get destroyed. Why are we so arrogant to believe that we should master the actions that once brought us to a place where we were hopelessly lost? God delivered us from that lifestyle.

If you're practicing or considering socially drinking again, please play the tape all the way through. **Consider the faces you may be putting on the line as you gamble on whether or not you're going to be the one that can handle it.**

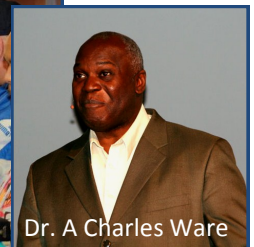


Of the 13 men in my 2007 SLT class, most relapsed in some form and 5 re-entered the program. It all started with social drinking.
