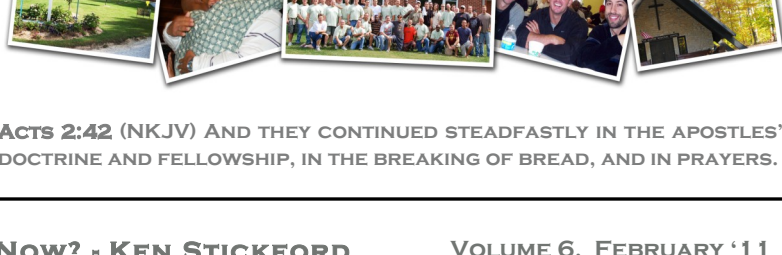

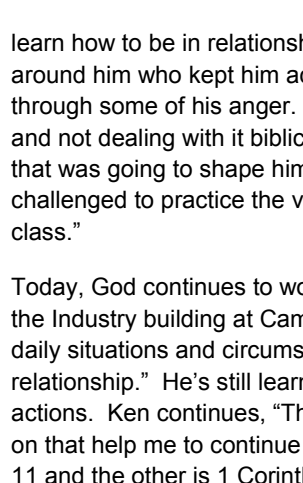

Years of crime and living for himself left Ken looking at prison time. He was tired of living that way. Ken knew his life was meant to be something different, and he came into the Hebron Program on February 2nd, 2006. Ken says, "I knew God had a call on my life."

"My time in the program was challenging", says Ken. He had to learn how to be in relationship with others, and he had brothers around him who kept him accountable. This helped him to work through some of his anger. Being used to bottling up his anger and not dealing with it biblically, God began a process in his life that was going to shape him into a new man. Ken says, "I was challenged to practice the very things that I was learning in class."

Today, God continues to work in Ken's life, while he works at the Industry building at Camp Hunt. Ken says, "Through my daily situations and circumstances, I'm still learning how to be in relationship." He's still learning to love others more through his actions. Ken continues, "There are a few verses that I meditate on that help me to continue to grow in these areas; 1 John 2:9-11 and the other is 1 Corinthians 13." Ken believes that God has called him to where he is now, and he has a real burden for those who want something different in life just as he did.

Through this walk with the Lord, Ken has learned about a life that is more rewarding, and has been able to experience some fruit in his life. Recently, Ken has seen communication open up between himself and his daughter Kendra. This has been a prayer answered for Ken after fifteen years without communication. Ken has also had the opportunity to participate as a night Chaplain at Backstreet Mission, a place where he once went through a program in 2004. He's now able to share the Hope of Christ with others who are within the same walls he once lived. He's been attending Business Management classes at Ivy Tech, and is hoping to graduate next year with a 4.0 grade average. He is also completing his ICAADA certification for CADAC II.

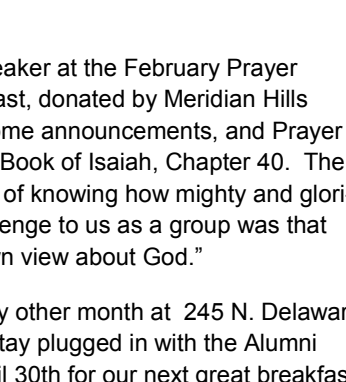

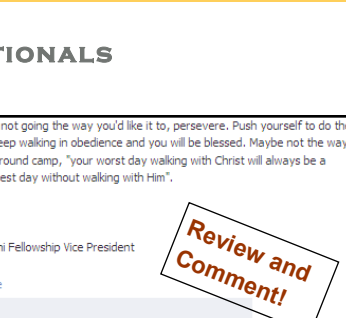
