After Paul got settled into the Hebron program, his attitude started to change. He shares, "Hebron helped guide me to understand the difference between knowing about God and knowing God. I can see the destruction that my addiction left behind me, which I am still cleaning up today with God's help. However, it is because of my addiction that I saw my need for God."

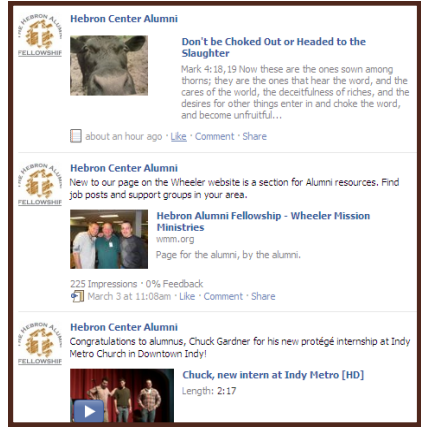
